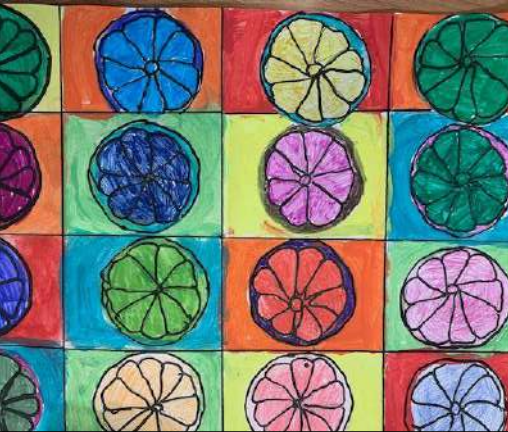

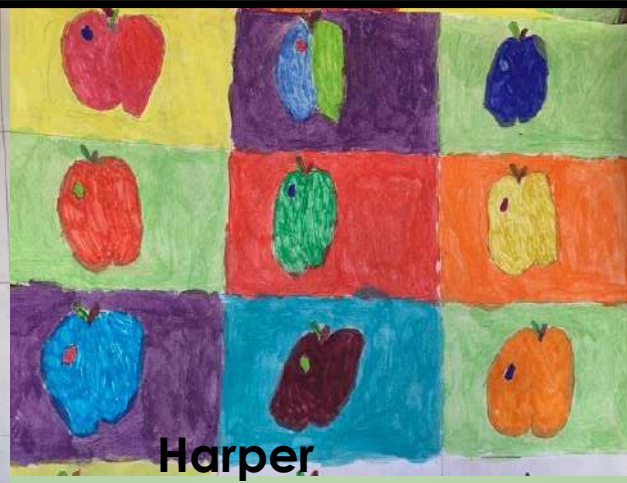

Environmental Science - Muntjacs



This week Muntjacs harvested seeds from plants that we grew. Completing the first cycle of a life cycle of a plant. We made origami seed envelopes out of old seed catalogues to store them in, over winter so that we can begin the process again in spring. We harvested spinach, tomato, pumpkin, poppy, lychnis, toad flax and sunflower seeds
