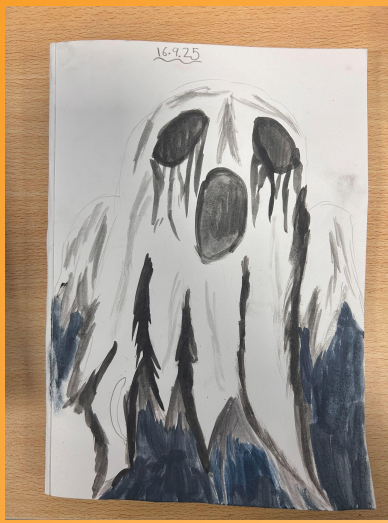

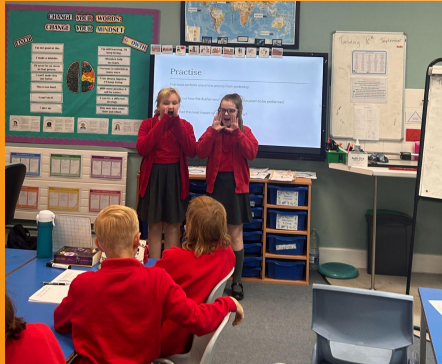
Kite class have been very creative this week using their knowledge of expressionism art to make their own masterpieces and painting borders to present our cogheart based poems in.



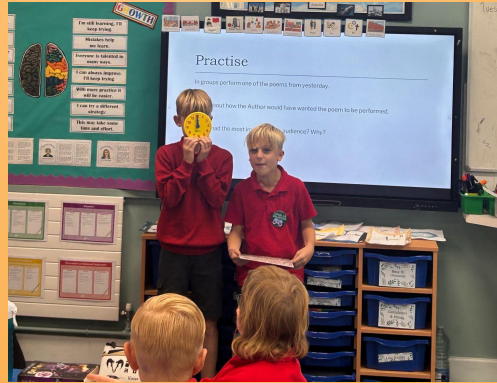
"The Scary" by Evie inspired by expressionism art we have been researching.

Aiden and Rhys performed a humorous, rhyming poem about a clock even using a clock as a prop!

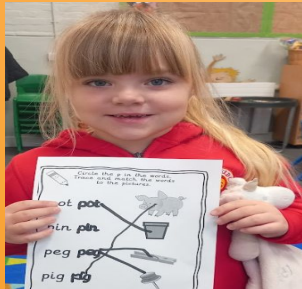
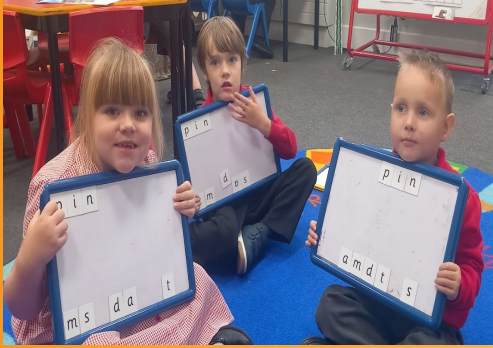


Rhys used a range of techniques to paint his background for a poem to be presented on.

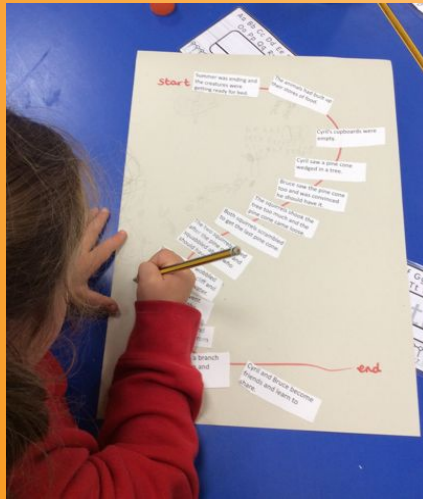
Little Wrens

This week Little Wrens have been working hard to blend and segment. They are already building cvc words!

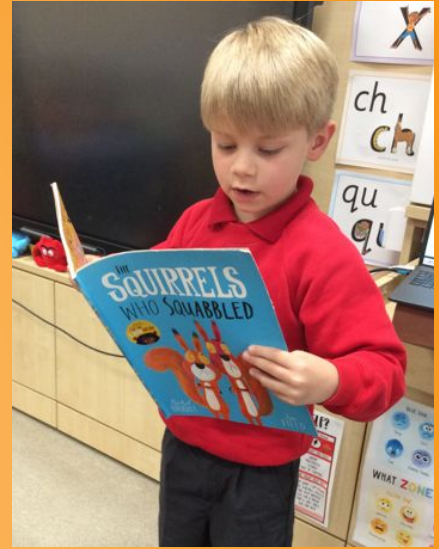
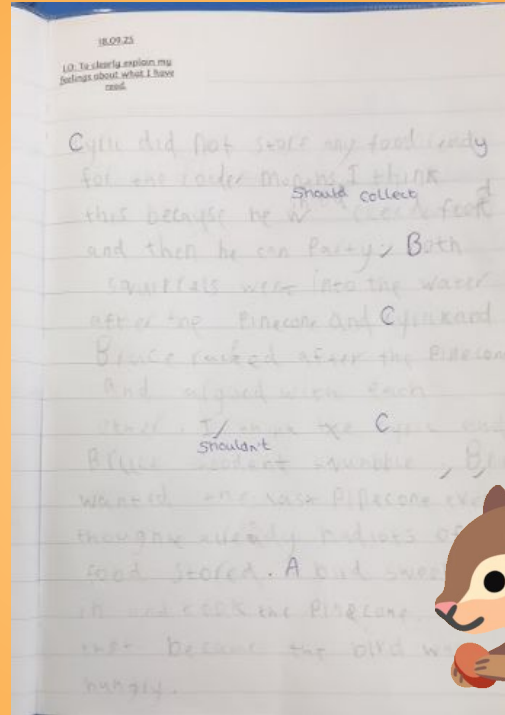
In mathematics they have been learning to order and count accurately to 5.
