
## Friday 3rd October





Kites looked at the cutouts of Henry Matisse. We then listened to the jazz of Miles Davis to create our own cutouts. The results are pretty groovy!






We harvested the last of our school grown onions and gave them to Mrs Elliston for our school dinners. Yum!
