- ✓ Have a clear and consistent approach to expectation, rewards and consequences.
- Contact parents/carers as soon as concerns are raised about their child's work, behaviour, attendance or punctuality.

Parent and Carer

- ✓ Give praise and positive feedback to promote and foster pride in the school and community your children are part of.
- ✓ Attend parents meetings, aiming to be positive and productive, to discuss my child's achievement and progress.
- ✓ Support and work with the school to ensure that the behaviour policies of the Federation are maintained.
- ✓ Read all communications sent home from the school.
- ✓ Inform the school immediately of any change to emergency contact details.
- ✓ Respect the confidentiality of each child, including on social media.
- ✓ Adhering to all school policies in particular to behaviour, complaints, IT (acceptable use), social media and uniform.
- ✓ Be respectful towards all staff.
