


Otters enjoyed reflecting on assembly this week and setting themselves 2026 'goals'. We look forward to reflecting back on them and seeing if we manage to achieve them.





Mrs Carvey's little fox cub is called Rory. Welcome to the skulk (fox family)!




Foxes enjoyed a very wet and muddy forest school session on Tuesday!

As the night fell over Bethlehem, the excitement of the crowds continued to grow, the shining bright star was almost blinding everyone there. Will this baby really be the new messiah?


