Foxes created some fun Christmas cards this week by putting miniature versions of themselves into baubles. Merry Christmas, everyone!

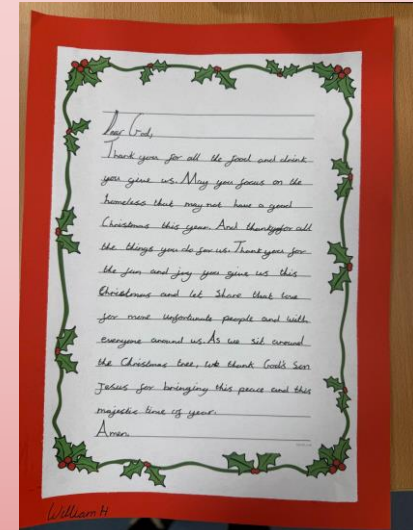
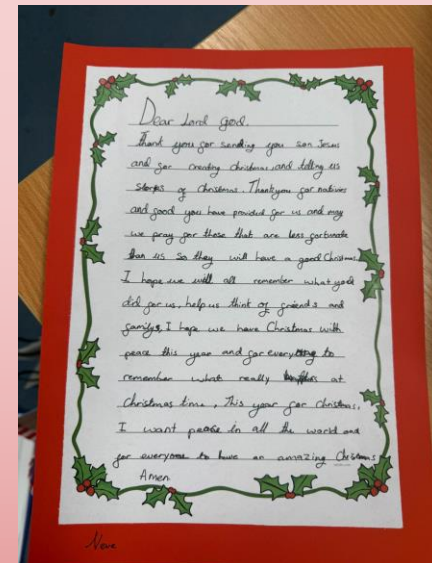
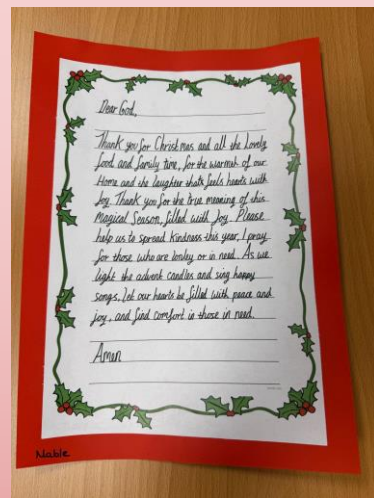
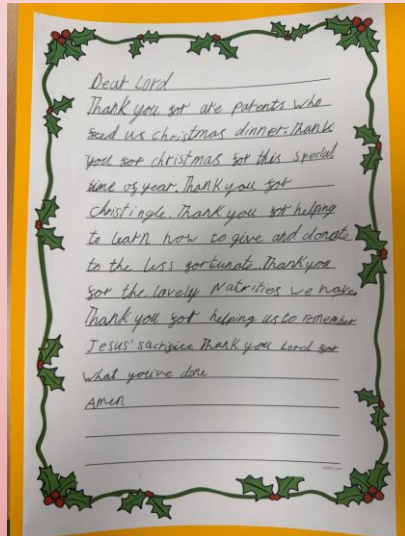




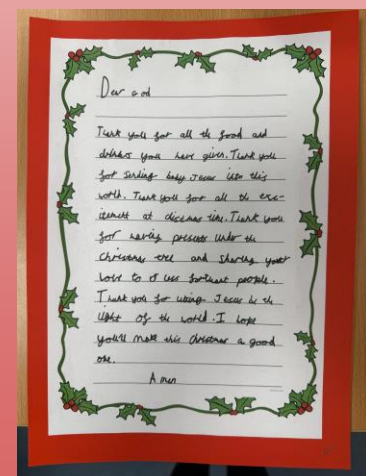
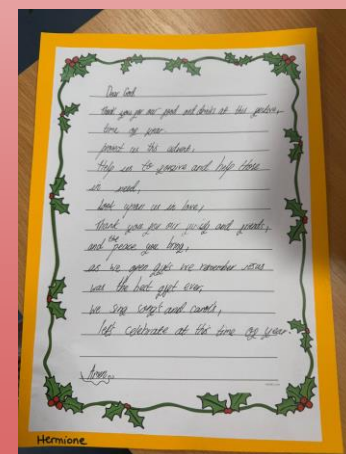
