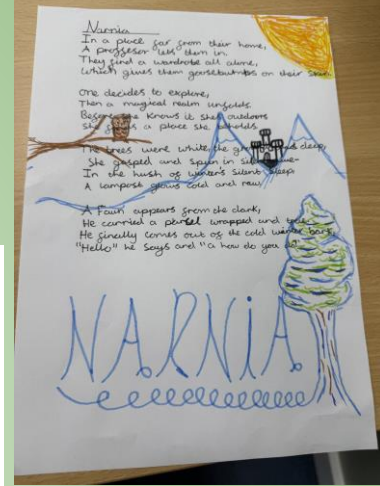
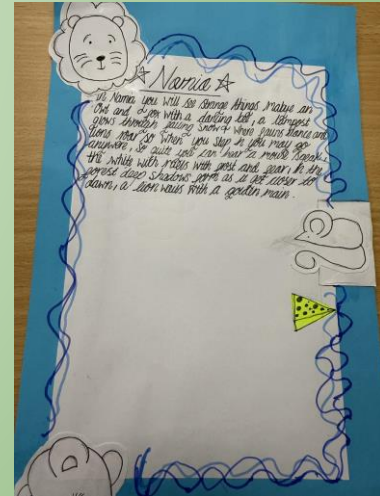
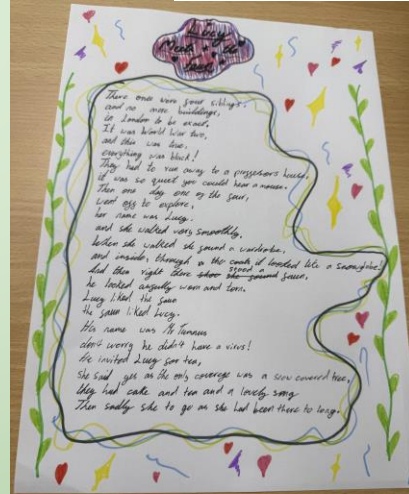
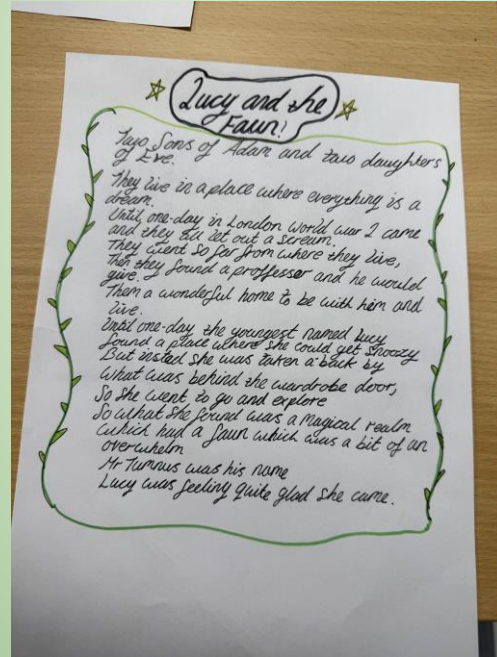
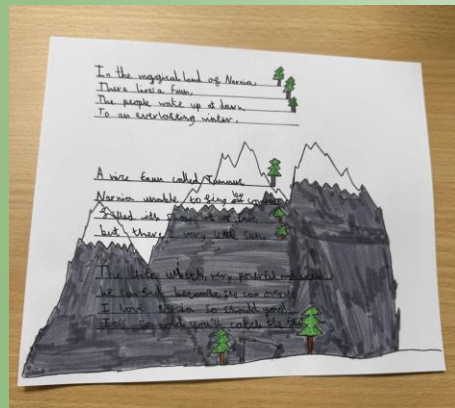
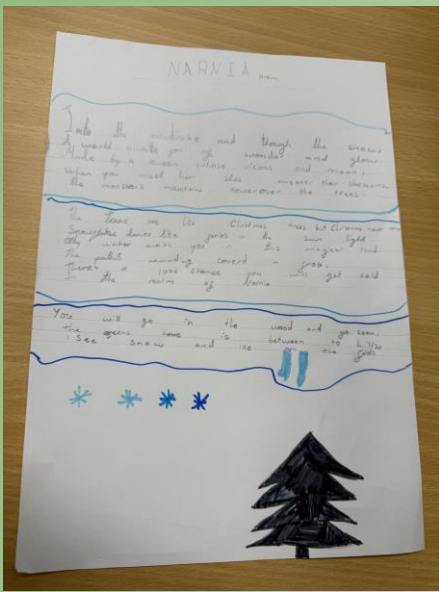


Friday 3rd October

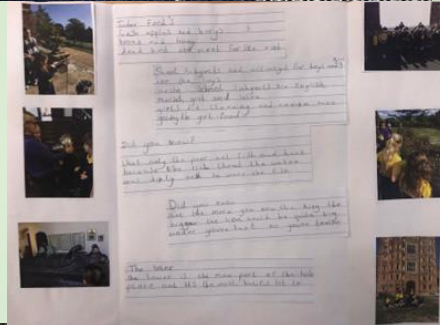
After our secateur training, we got stuck in and began clearing. GREAT teamwork!!
