This week we listened to eight heavy rock songs. Ethan loves rock so picked two of the songs.



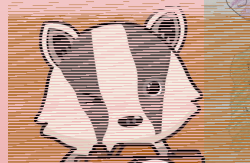
In history we became artists for Captain Cook. We painted the ship Endeavour, and drew life in eighteenth century Tahiti.

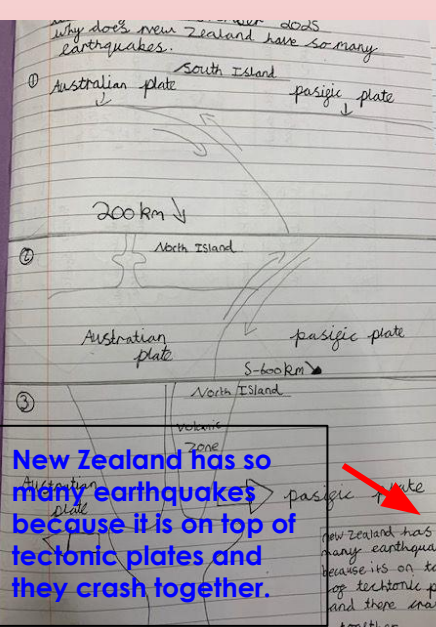
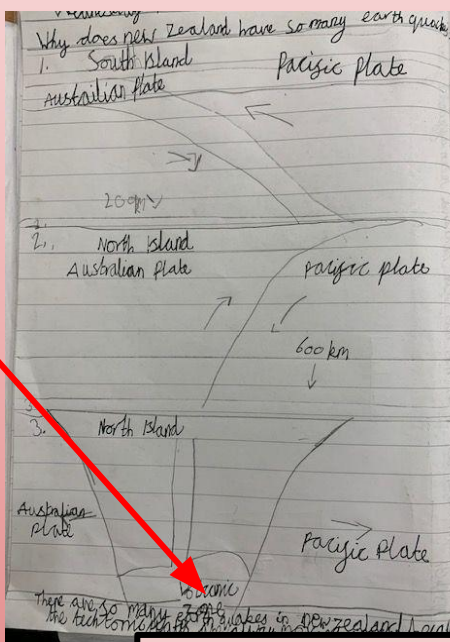

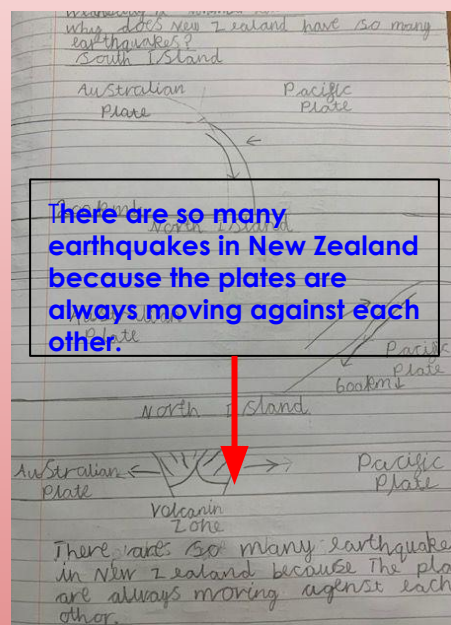


'There are so many earthquakes because the tectonic plates are always moving.'

New Zealand has so many earthquakes because it is on top of tectonic plates and they crash together.

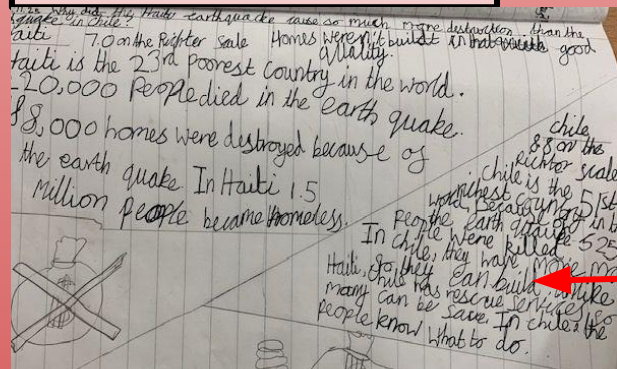
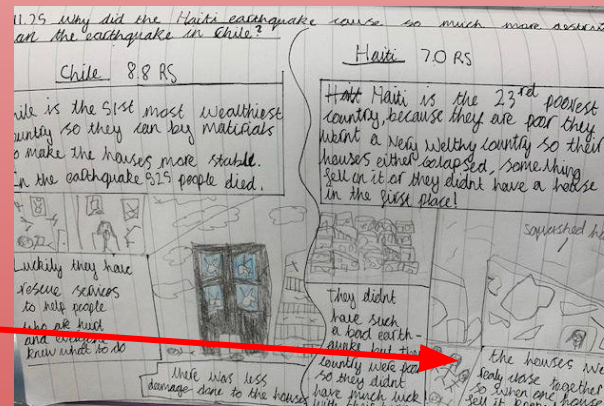


There are so many earthquakes in New Zealand because the plates are always moving against each other.
