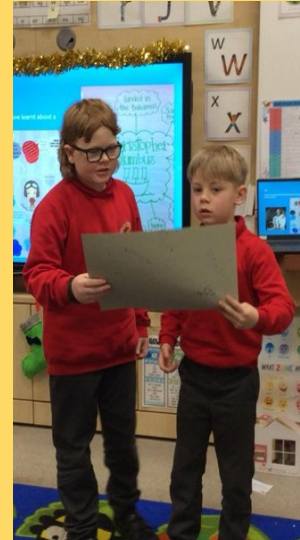




# Wrens

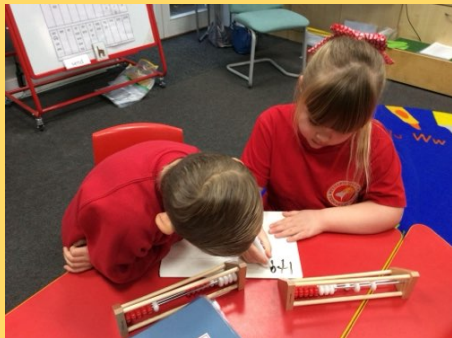
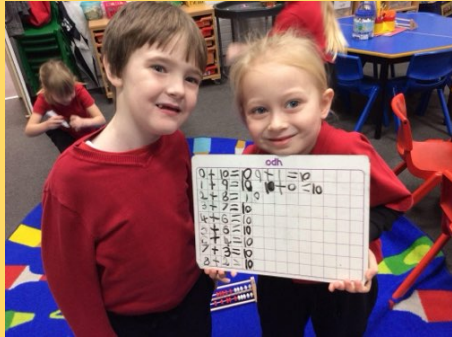


In mathematics this week Year 1 and Reception have been using Rekenreks and ten frames to systemically work on number bonds to ten.

In English we are enjoying the story 'The Owl who was scared of the Dark'. The children wrote questions for Plop the owl and then took turns hot seating being Plop.



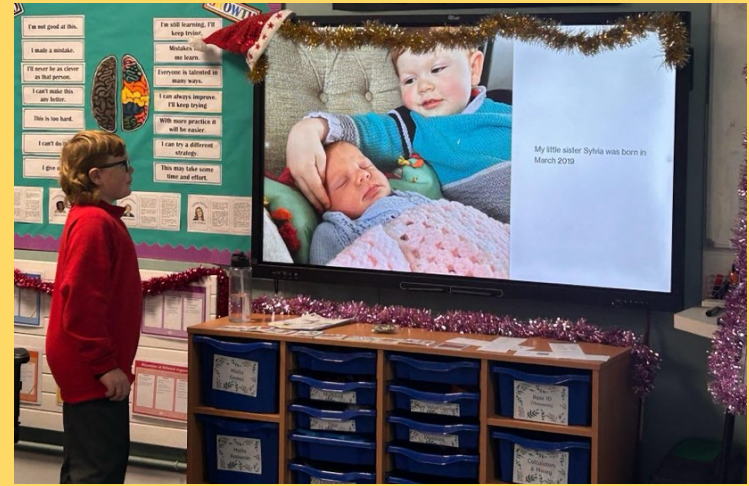
Year 2 have been working hard on using their number bonds to subtract across 10. Some of the children even went one step further and wrote fact families related to the subtraction number sentences.





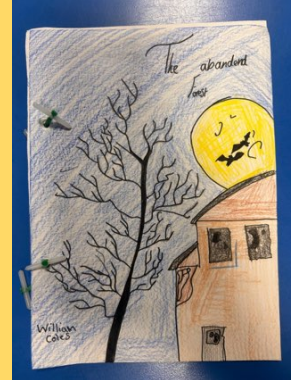
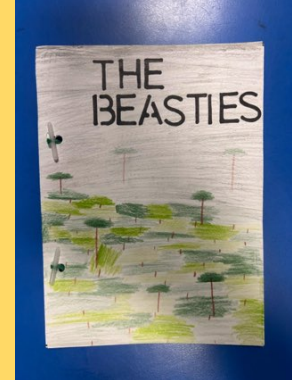
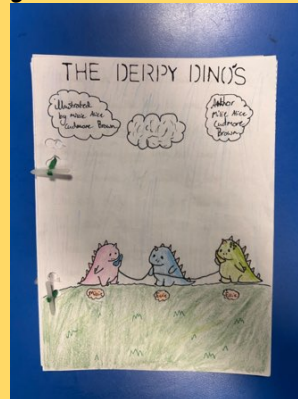
# KITES

*This week, Kites have finished their adventure stories and turned them into mini books. Here is a selection to share with everyone.*

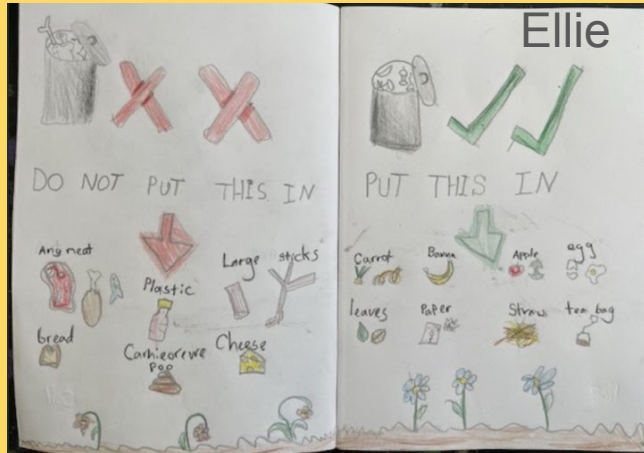


# Environmental Science - Wethersfield

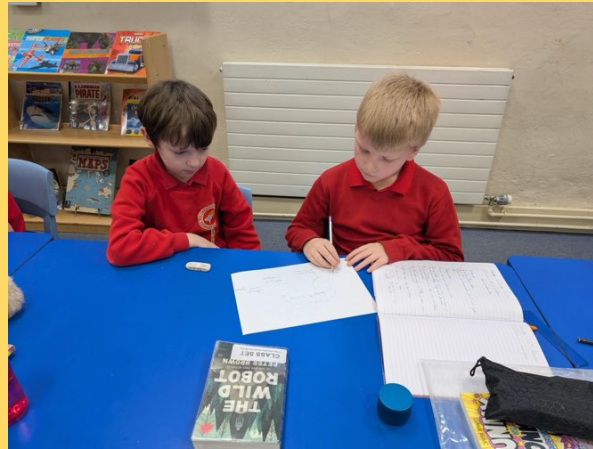
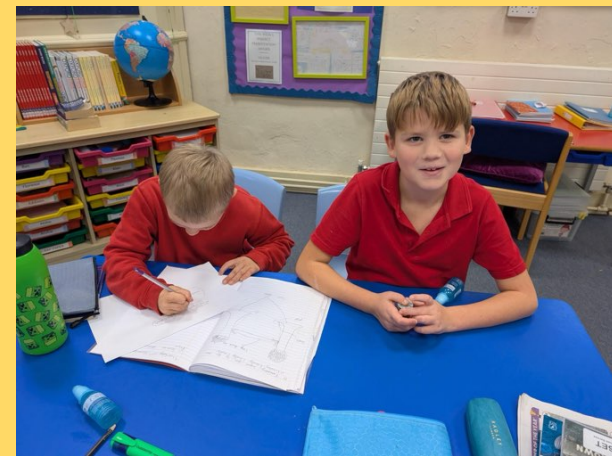
