


Stirling on the rollercoaster





In forest school this week we learnt how snow crystals form and grow in the clouds, starting as a tiny speck of dust or pollen that water vapor gets stuck to and then freezes.



We also learnt that snow crystals always start off with a hexagon and have 6 arms or branches, but they keep changing their shapes and patterns whilst falling gently to the ground, and because of this each snow crystal is beautifully unique.

We made our own unique snow crystals using natural materials.





This week in literacy Wrens have been reading “Where the Wild Things Are” - the children made predictions about what might happen in the story, they made a list of rules that the character should follow and wrote a diary entry from the perspective of Max. Beatrice shared her ideas with the class. Little Wrens created their own Wild Things!
