
Friday 21st November




A huge thank you to Mrs Finch for designing the Christmas tree templates that the children decorated for the church Christmas tree. They will look amazing!






Millie found out that Amelia Earhart saved up for 6 months to buy a second hand plane to begin flying.




William wrote on his factfile that Amelia Earhart was inspired to be a pilot after looking after injured soldiers and pilots during the war.

This week was all about how soil is made! We learnt how rocks and stones break up and mix with organic matter.


