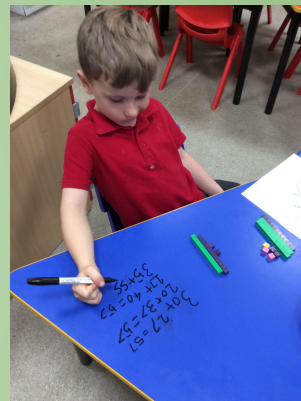
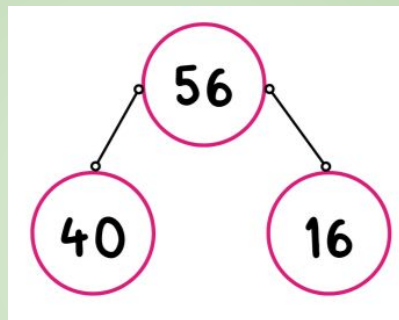


Wrens

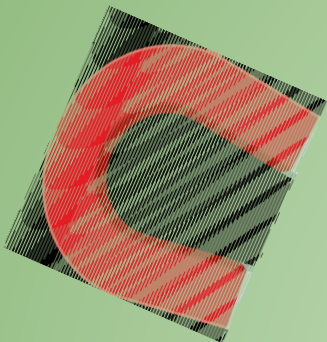


In Mathematics this week, Wrens have been working on place value and flexibly partitioning numbers up to 100.

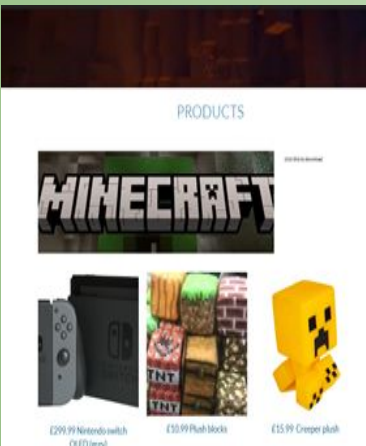




We continue to complete some amazing home learning, this week it was Garlic bread rolls. They were all eaten at home, perhaps we'll get to try some next time :)



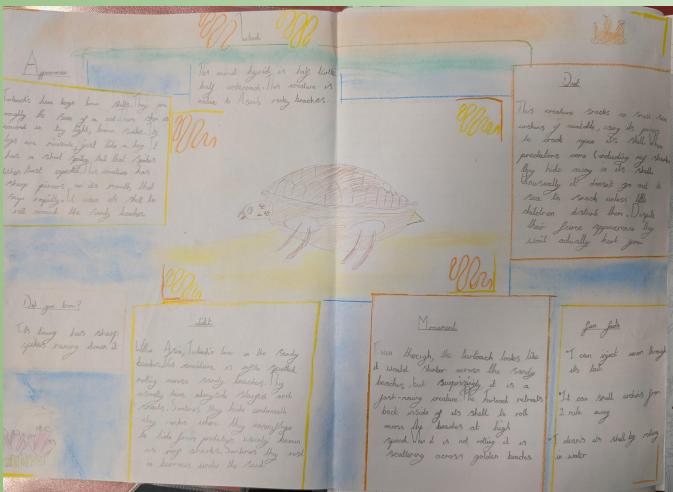
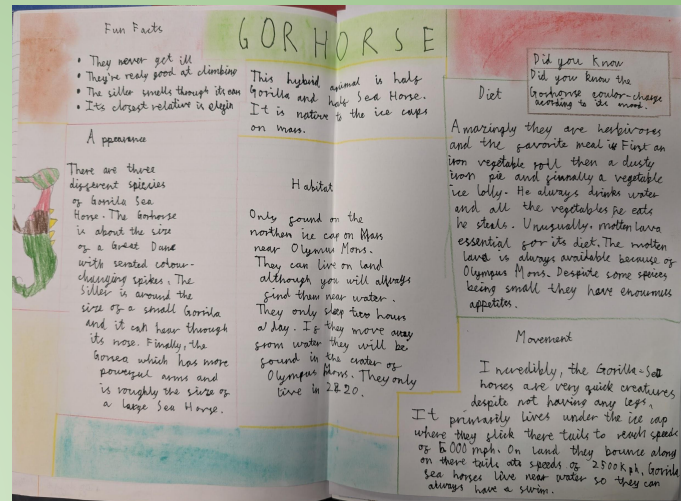
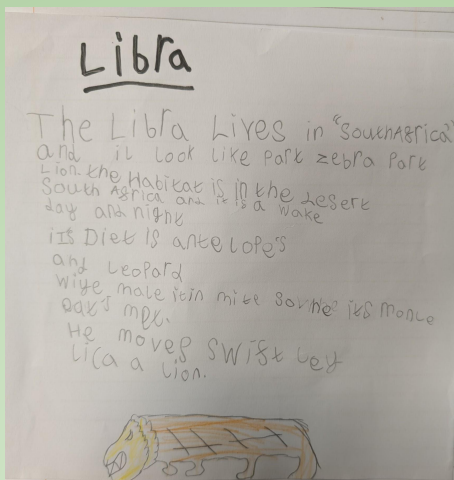
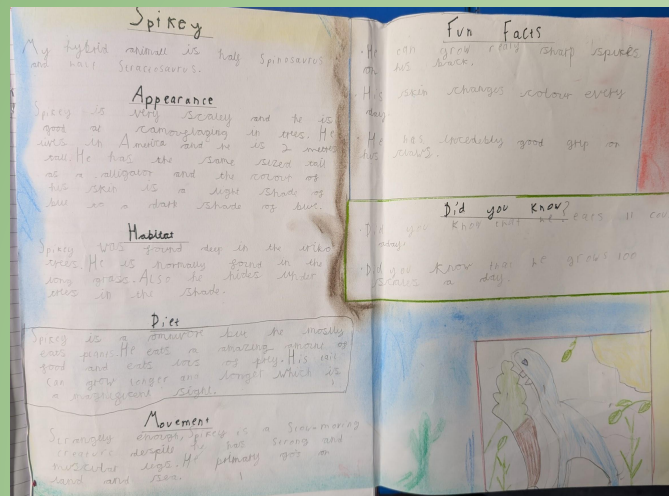
Kites have been out in the community representing Wethersfield primary at a remembrance service. Two members of the public approached me to say how impressed they were with how respectful and well behaved we were!



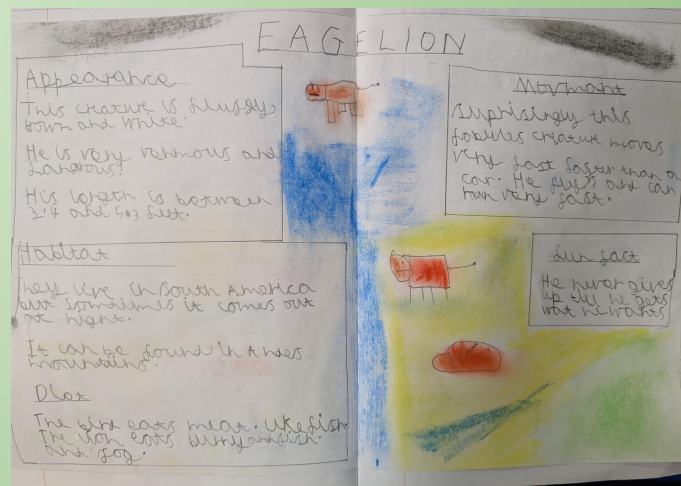
Some of Kites (and swifts) represented our school for cross country. Rhys won his race! But we are proud of all of you, well done all.
